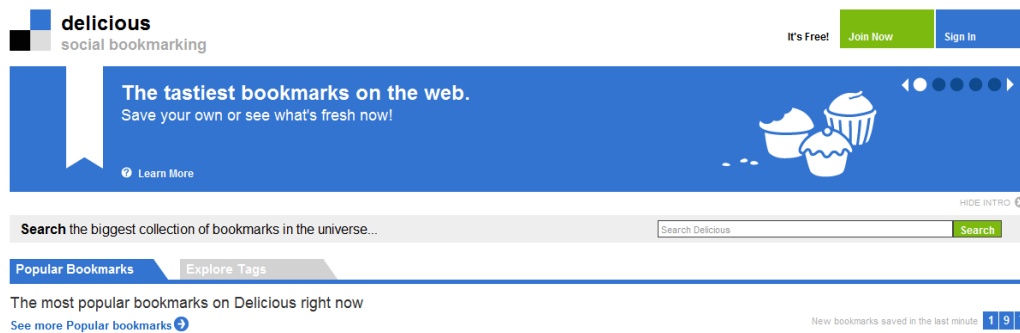


## Registering for an Account

1. If you closed your Internet browser from the previous lesson, open it and navigate to Delicious - <http://www.delicious.com>.



2. Click "Join Now" in the upper right corner of the screen.

3. Fill out the required information to register for an account.

NOTE: you can set up a personal account, one for your class, one for a department, or one for the entire school. You might also think about setting up an account for students and one for teachers to keep resources separate. It all depends upon what type of social bookmarking community you want to build. If your interested in connecting with other science teachers, you might think about setting up an account, such as walkerscience, or if you are interested in building a inclusive community between experts, educators and students, you might think about setting up an account for the entire school.

4. Click register. Two screens are provided to add popular automatically. You can skip these steps and when registration is complete go to the "Home" screen.

5. When you return to your account later, you will want to click "Sign In" in the upper right corner of the screen.

6. Click on the "Bookmark" tab at the top of the screen. Then click on "Save a new bookmark" in the menu in the upper right corner of your screen.

7. NOTE: You will need to go to a search engine, such as Google to find a link. Make sure to copy the entire link. To copy the link, go to "Edit" in the file menu of your browser, and then click "copy". You can also right click and select copy.

8. Paste the URL (uniform resource locator) or address into the textbox for URL, then click "Next".

9. The URL will appear in the first textbox. Insert a title, add any notes to help you remember what the site is about, and add your tags. You can insert tags by typing in a name, or selecting ones from the recommended or popular categories.

10. To select a tag, click on it; it will appear in your tag list (textbox).

NOTE: Tags are used to sort your tags into various folders. You can make up tags (categories) of your own (called folksonomies) or use the recommended or popular tags listed below the "tags" textbox.

11. Click "Save" when you are ready to save the resource.

12. Repeat this process 3-4 times with websites you want to bookmark to get the hang of it.

## Editing or Deleting Tags

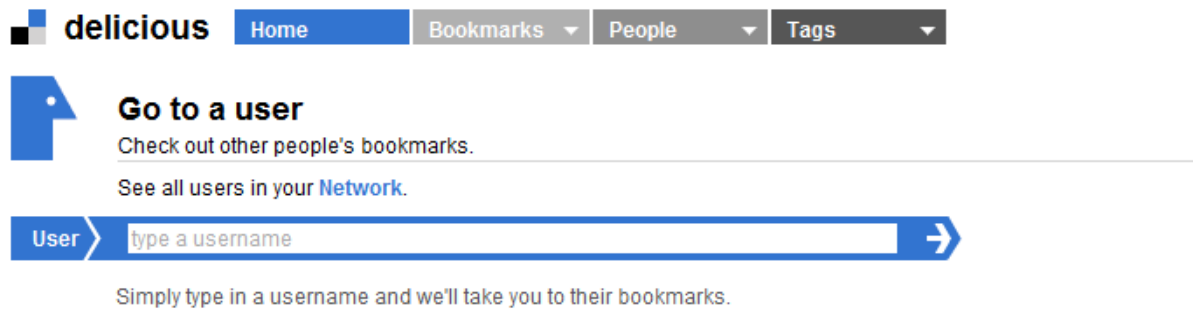
13. As you enter more and more tags, you will see your list grow. At times you may want to edit the description and the tags. To edit a tag, click on "Edit" and insert any other tags you wish by typing in the tag textbox. You can also delete tags by clicking in the box after the tag you want to delete and then hitting backspace until you erase the word.

14. When you are finished, click "Save".

15. To delete a tag, click the delete link below the resource.

### Check Out Other User's Network

16. To see another person's network, click on "People" at the top of the screen. Then click on "Go to a user" in the menu in the upper right corner of the window.

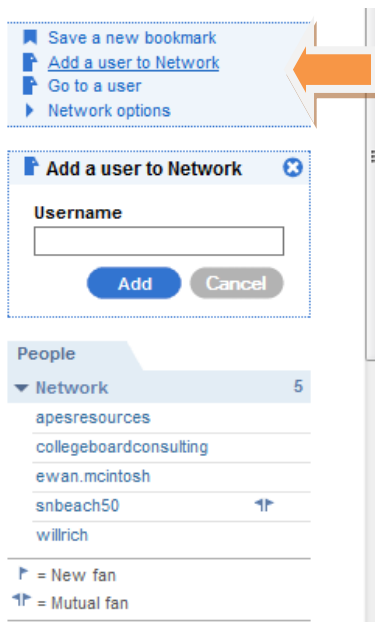


17. Enter their "Username".

18. Click the arrow to enter the information.

19. Spend a few minutes reviewing their bookmarks. If they are tagging resources you can use for your class, then you might think about adding them to your network.

### Adding a User to Your Network



20. To add a user to your network, click on "Add User to Network" in the menu in the upper right corner of your window.

21. Type in the "Username" (ex. tcooper66, or apesresources)

22. Click "Add".

NOTE: This is where networked learning comes to life. As you add more users to your network, you can see what they are bookmarking. Linking to other's tag networks will help you find resources that you could not find on your own, or that you just wouldn't have time to research. As your network grows, you will have more and more people finding resources for you.

## Managing a Network Bundle

23. After awhile, you may have a number of users in your network and want to group them; for example, by school. To create a network bundle, click on "People" at the top of the screen.

24. Click on "Network Options" in the menu in the upper right corner of the screen.


25. Click on "Manage Network Bundles".

26. Click "Create".

27. Type in a name for your bundle.

28. Check the box for each network you want to bundle together.



32. Choose the tag you want to rename from the drop-down box.

33. Enter the name of the new tag.

34. Click "Save". Delicious will now rename every tag of that name in each link that you have saved.

35. You can also delete a tag from each resource, by clicking on "Tags" and then "Delete Tags".


36. Pick a tag to delete from our resource links and click "Delete".

37. The program will now delete that tag from each link you have saved.






39. To create a tag bundle, click on “Tags” then click on “Manage Tag Bundles”.
40. Click “Create”.

41. Enter the name of the tag bundle.
42. Type the tags you want to add to the bundle. Delicious provides a list of your tags below.
43. Click “Save”.

This is where you'll find bookmarks that have been sent to you by other users. When you receive a bookmark, the little mail icon in the top right corner will let you know.

To send a bookmark to another person's Inbox, tag the bookmark with "for:" followed by their username, like "for:auser". That person might even send you one back!

If you add people to your [Network](#), it's even easier to send them bookmarks, because when saving a bookmark, the **People** tab will contain their names. You can click those names to automatically add "for:" tags with their usernames.

44. Click on "In Box" in the upper right hand side of the screen.

45. To send a bookmark to another person's Inbox, tag the bookmark with "for:" followed by their username, like "for:auser". That person might even send you one back!

<a href="#">Facebook Application</a>	Enhance your Facebook account with content and notifications from your bookmarks.

<a href="#">Edit Network</a>	Add and remove users to your network.
<a href="#">Edit Network Bundles</a>	Create groups of people from your network.
<a href="#">Set Network Privacy</a>	Hide the contents of your network from other people.

**Tags**

<a href="#">Rename Tags</a>	Revise your tag list by renaming tags.
